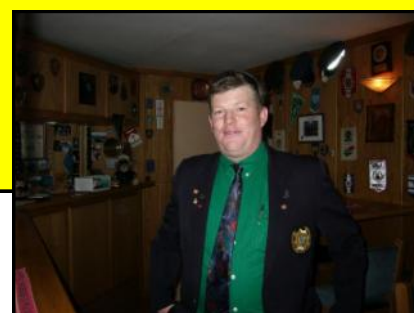

New number plates

Announcing the new system on Friday, 10 September, the transport MEC, Bheki Nkosi, said a project team had been set up to fast-track the implementation of the new licence plates.

"The requisite legislative process was completed and regulations were published in July 2010, which specified that as from 1 November 2010, only aluminium plate format, as specified in the Government Gazette, should be supplied to vehicle owners or proxies of vehicle owners," he said.

New number plates will be aluminium and sold by approved manufacturers, costing an estimated R350 a set. The new plates will eradicate illegal duplicates. The new plates will be allocated when new vehicles are registered, and a roll call is scheduled for old number plates to be replaced.

The transport department is expected to run out of numbers to allocate under the current system by December. Already on the "ZW" prefix, the current Gauteng system has three letters of the alphabet followed by three numbers and GP.

The new sequence for number plates will be two letters, starting with BB, followed by two numbers, another two letters and the GP abbreviation for the province. The plates will also have a chip containing information about the vehicle owner.

Earlier this year, Premier Nomvula Mokonyane announced in her [State of the Province address](#) that the new licence system would come into effect in October.

However, because of logistical problems, the date had to be moved, according to Nkosi. "We went on tender and the results indicated that there were a number of risks that were likely to affect the rollout as envisaged. The department was also concerned that there was only one supplier for both the tags tender

and the Central Verification Centre (CVC) service provider and this would have resulted in uncompetitive pricing."

It was decided that a revised approach should be taken that would deliver the project in stages. The department since decided to roll out the new number series on aluminium plates as soon as the last combinations of the current plates were issued.

Apart from focusing on compliance with the new regulations and roll out of the aluminium plates, the department would also focus on the Intelligent Transport System (ITS) framework that was recently adopted by the provincial executive council. It would help in introducing intelligent components in the phases once detailed technological investigations had been concluded.

"The plan is to bring the intelligent elements in over a period of 24 months," he said.

Ultimately, once the rollouts are complete, motorists who have not changed their number plates will be **fined**.

According to the vehicle registration system [eNaTIS](#), there were 3,78 million "live" vehicles registered in Gauteng, including trailers and caravans. This was 38,87 percent of the total registered in the country -- the highest number of registrations.

There were 23 644 new vehicle registrations in August, 49 percent of the national total.

Nkosi concluded by saying: "We are committed to the regulation of the number plate industry in order to eliminate fraud and corruption and thus reduce theft of vehicles. To achieve this goal, we need to implement the best and most cost-effective solutions for the citizens of Gauteng."

Costly not to have a warning triangle in car

DRIVING around without carrying an emergency warning triangle could cost you far more than the sign itself is worth if caught by traffic officials.

This is one of the 2 055 charges in the Administrative Adjudication of Road Traffic Offences (Aarto) charge book. It carries a fine of R500 if the vehicle a motorist was driving did not carry at least one emergency warning sign.

There are exemptions, however, for motorists, whose vehicles were registered before July 2006, as well as ambulances and motorcycles.

"All other vehicles registered after July 2007 and found driving without a warning triangle will be eligible for a fine. If the car was registered by the previous owner before July 2006 and you as the new owner registered it only after July 2007 you will not be exempted," said Joburg metro police spokesman Chief Superintendent Wayne Minnaar.

"Even 1960 models that were registered after July 2007 would have had to carry a warning triangle to pass the test.

"It is not about the model or whether the previous owner registered it but it is the last date on which it was registered under its current owner that counts."

In a case where an officer had made an error or miscalculated the dates and given a motorist a fine when the car could have been exempted, Minnaar said this could be rectified. He said, however, there was constant communication with officers about the new rules to avoid any errors.

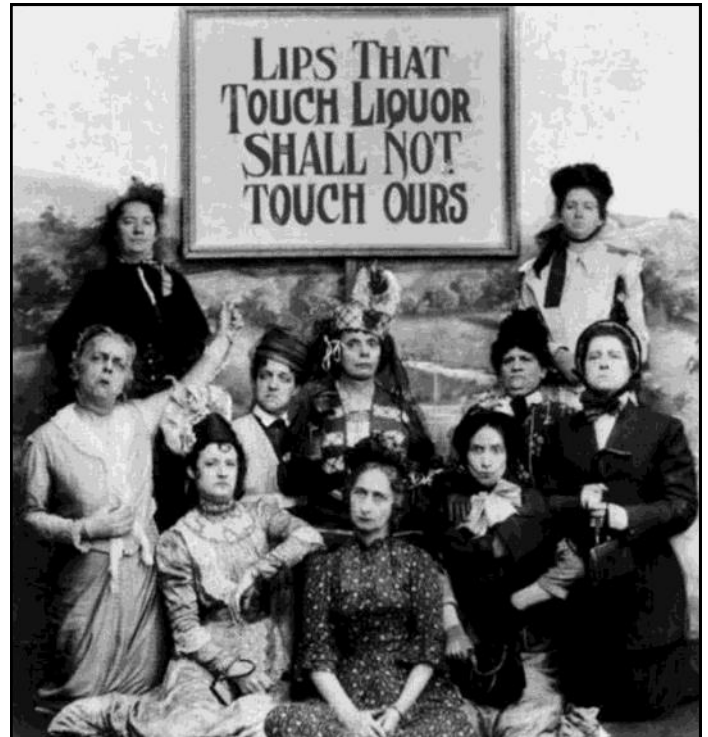
A photographer at the Star, Etienne Rothbart, experienced the new law first hand last Tuesday, when he was pulled over on Smit Street, Braamfontein. Rothbart had been driving a borrowed vehicle while his own car was being repaired, and when he was pulled over, he was asked whether or not the car had a warning triangle. When it turned out that the car did not have a triangle, the police officer issued him a R500 ticket for his offence. However, what the officer failed to take into account was that the car had been registered in 1998. Rothbart is currently attempting to have the ticket quashed.
