**37TH IPA IEC CONFERENCE
HELD AT BUCHAREST ROMANIA
SEPTEMBER 2011**

As IPA (SA) President it was a privileged and honour to represent IPA South Africa. In his opening speech in the Romania Parliament, Michael Odysseos the International IPA President said the following (extracts from his speech)

“The IEC Conference is attended by Delegations from 58 IPA Sections. It is a large IPA gathering almost all IPA Sections represented”.

The Romanian Section was founded on 31st August 1992 with the help and guidance of the Hellenic Section. In October 1996, during the IEC Conference in Brisbane, Australia, it was unanimously admitted into the IPA family. Although at the beginning there were some reservations from some Sections, the Romanian Section very soon proved to be very active and, today, is the 2nd largest IPA Section with nearly 60 000 members. From the date of its establishment the IPA officials worked hard to promote the IPA ideals not only in the territory of Romania but also at the neighbouring Country of Moldavia. In the year 2008 acting as the sponsor Section, worked hard for the establishment of an IPA Section in the Republic of Moldova which was achieved in 2010.



Dear friends, the year under review has been characterised again by violence and hardship. In many Countries local wars continue and international terrorism is on the increase, costing the lives of innocent people. A World where people can live together in peace and harmony still seems far away. Besides the violence and international terrorism,

serious calamities, earthquakes, the tsunami, floods, fires and hurricanes struck many Countries, resulting in thousands of deaths and total destructions of property. Unfortunately IPA members, and members of their families, were among the victims. The PEB, based on the recommendations of the Chairman of the ISC, activated the Procedure for Emergency-Aid and launched appeals for donations. The IPA members responded positively and donated money and other goods for the relief of their colleagues.

It therefore pleases me to notice that the basic ideals of friendship and solidarity among IPA member in all Sections, as introduced in 1950 by our Founder Arthur Troop, are still very much alive within the IPA family. Our Association has had an incredible development over the past 61 years and that is something still going on to-day. The fact that this positive development has been achieved, not through direct advertising, but through personal contacts between police officers in different Countries, proves the strength behind these ideals. It seems that despite all dissention between people and States, there is still place for friendship and solidarity across the borders.

It is up to us all to be educators of peace, of human rights, of a freedom which respects each person, but also to ensure increasingly strong social bonds, because man must take care of his brothers and sisters without discrimination. No individual in the National Community should be excluded on the ground of his or her race, religion or any other personal characteristic. Together, as members of different religions, traditions and cultures we are called to spread a teaching which honours all human creatures, a message of love and friendship between individuals and peoples. We are particularly responsible for ensuring that our young colleagues, who will take over from us, are formed in this spirit.

IPA World day : This matter was discussed and many issues were raised, what day it should be. The PEB did not want to be prescriptive that IPA should have a specific day or a day at all but was of the opinion it could be something nice.

During the conference Pilot Loots handed over 50 Euros to Japan and 50 Euros to America for their Disaster Relief funds. Every donation helps for the wellbeing of those who suffered.

The next IPA World Congress will be in Eilat Israel from 4 – 9 September 2012 (Cost 650 Euro) followed by a Friendship week (Costs 750 Euro). More details will be published in the Amikeco Newsletter.

MESSAGE FOR CHRISTMAS 2011

From IPA(SA) member;

The Reverend (Dr) Kruger

1 CORINTHIANS 13

I bring you a Christmas message with a difference. You will notice that 1 Corinthians 13 is not the usual scripture reading around this time of year. Please bear with me!!

Throughout this wonderful song about love, the word "agape" is used. When translated correctly, the word means **absolute or complete or perfect love**. The only place we can find this kind of love is with God. The emotional upwelling of feelings we experience when we encounter loved ones or grand children or pets, can never be equal to the perfect love of God as expressed in "agape."

Whenever we read 1 Corinthians 13, we should try to forget the feelings we have when we talk about love. Rather read this chapter as follows: "Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, **and have not the love of God that was so absolute or great or perfect, that He gave His only begotten son to die in our place on the cross, so that we who belong to the Son, can be reconciled with God.** I have become a sounding brass or a tinkling cymbal".

Every time the word love appears in this chapter, substitute it with the underlined section above. You will read a bit longer, but you will realise that our concept of love and that of the Lord is not the same thing.

Yes, God gave his Son on a glorious day when the time was full and ripe. He was the expression of God's absolute love for mankind, and through Him He brought salvation and justification for those who accept Him as the Messiah who has come in the world. He is also the living word of God and through His Spirit He leads us in the whole truth (John 16)

However, to treat 1 Corinthians 13 as a mere song of love is a big mistake. We are confronted with a love so pure and complete, that it becomes an accusation of God against His church. "You say you love me and your fellow man? Can you compare your love against the mirror held before you in 1 Cor. 13? Is your love without condition, jealousy, boastfulness and pride? Is it patient, not demanding, not irritable? God's love as expressed in His son is the yardstick against which we must measure our commitment towards the cause of the Son of God!

He expects of us to have the same attitude Jesus had. It is best described in Philippians 2: 1-5: "Is there any encouragement from belonging to Christ? Any comfort from His love? Any fellowship together in the Spirit? Are your hearts tender and compassionate? Then make me truly happy by agreeing wholeheartedly with each other, loving one another, and working together with one mind and purpose.

Don't be selfish; Don't try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves. Don't look out for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too. You must have the same attitude that Jesus had."

Only then can we truly say that His birth meant something to us. We should always remember that the Bible most people will read, is your life and mine.

May you and yours have a blessed Christmas.

We have many religions and holidays in South Africa and if it is possible can some of our non Christian IPA friends send me some information on your religion and holidays so I can also publish it in our National Newsletter.

COMMISSION FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS

On 31 January 2011, the Secretary General of the United Nations in a press conference reminded all NGO's that our role is paramount for the smooth operation of the United Nations and that our opinions, action and recommendations would be taken into account.

The role of the IPA, as a major International NGO in the field of security should enable us to promote our initiatives based on the key themes of expertise, excellence, acknowledgement and a strategic view of global security. **Phillipe Antonie** is one of nine members of the Commission for External Affairs in Brussels.

During 2010, Philippe continued his exceptional liaison work with the European institutions in Brussels. The IPA is receiving increasing requests for consultancy services on international security matters.

In January 2011, Philippe went to Gimborn to start the preparations for a future IPA seminar on the theme of forgery and the protection of intellectual property.

With regard to this, a follow-up meeting was held on 15 February 2011, at the European Commission in Brussels. The following were present: Mr Tourne (national expert in die fields of organised crime, financial inquests, forgery and piracy), Klaus Nieder of IBZ Gimborn and our representative. This seminar, mostly sponsored, should enable the IBZ to train the greatest possible number of IPA participants on the subject of forgery.

On 16 November 2011 IPA (SA) had the privilege to welcome a very special guest, Phillippe Antoine at Amikeco Centre, IPA Head Office, Pretoria

He paid us a short visit on the 18th November before he flies home to Brussels. Phillippe is a regular visitor to our South African shores and is very fond of the South African culture.
